1. Discuss Covid-19 and the impact it has had on Parks and Recreation in San Joaquin County and the City of Ripon.

Director Stevens reported that on March 12, 2020 an emergency health order was declared by the State of California and San Joaquin County. The City of Ripon responded by closing all parks, playgrounds, restrooms and facilities. The City of Ripon also postponed all programs. The current health order allows for the use of parks and open space for exercise, however, the public is reminded that gatherings with people who are not members of your household are prohibited. Golfing and tennis (singles) are allowed. Everyone should social distance and try to maintain a distance of at least six feet. No one is sure how long Covid-19 will restrict Parks and Recreation so everything is on hold until further notice. The Parks and Recreation Department has plans in place to resume all recreation activities when it is safe to do so and the health order is lifted.

Covid-19 is having a significant impact financially to the City of Ripon. There is a loss of rental income since all facilities are closed and there will be refunds issued for all canceled programs with no money or limited money coming in for current and future recreation programs. This will not get better until youth sports are allowed to resume in California and San Joaquin County.
